Welcome to our guests –

Welcome to Immanuel. We are sincerely pleased to have you with us tonight. You are about to have a conversation with God, in God's own words. If you are familiar with the Bible, you will recognize the words that go into your ears and come out of your mouth. This is the Historic Liturgy, the structure of which goes all the way back to the days of Moses. We call it Divine Service, because the Lord Himself bestows on us His gifts of grace that Jesus earned for us through His righteous life and atoning death through His Word and Sacraments. Please read our Communion statement below.

Please sign your name in our guest register found in the narthex, and introduce yourself to the greeters and Pastor Colageo.

Families worshiping together – We encourage families to worship together. A nursery is located near the Narthex. If your child becomes restless during worship, you are welcome to use this facility. An usher would be willing to help you.

Cell phones – Please turn off your cell phones and other electronic devices before you enter the sanctuary.

Reverence in the Sanctuary –During the Service, the quiet times are an intentional part of the liturgy, such as during the playing of the prelude, Communion, and times of prayer. Please help us maintain a reverent atmosphere by not talking in the sanctuary before or during the service. Thank you.

Keep Communion cups visible – During Communion, if you use an individual cup, please keep it uncovered and visible so that Pastor Colageo can see who is waiting for the common cup.

Communion Statement: Tonight, we prayerfully partake of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. We believe that when we receive the bread and wine, we receive Christ's body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, we know not how. As we receive this holy mystery, we also give public confession to our unity in the Christian faith. We therefore invite all communicant members of any congregation of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod to commune. Guests are invited to come forward to receive a blessing. As it was with the very first disciples of Jesus, our practice is to receive instruction in the Faith leading to Holy Communion. If you would like to join our instruction class, Pastor would *love* to instruct you.

Therefore with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and saying:

**God of power and might: Heaven and earth are full of Your glory.

6:¹ Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ² For He says,

We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 6th chapter:

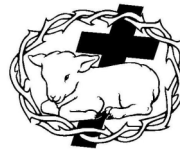
C: Glory be to You, O Lord.

¹“So, take heed that you do not do your righteousness in front of people, to be seen by them. Otherwise you have no reward from your Father who is in the heavens. ²Therefore, when you do mercy, do not sound a trumpet before you as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, in order to be glorified by the people.
Amen, I tell you, they are paid in full.

³ But when you do mercy, do not let your left know what your right is doing, ⁴in order that your mercy be cryptic; and your Father who sees what’s cryptic will Himself give back to you in the light. ⁵And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites. For they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the corners of the major streets in order to be seen by people. Amen, I tell you, they are paid in full.

⁶But you, when you pray, go into your private room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees what’s cryptic will Himself give back to you in the light. ¹⁶
“Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a long face. For they disfigure their faces in order to shine for people as those who are fasting.
Amen, I tell you, they are paid in full.

¹⁷ But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face¹⁸so that you don’t shine for people as those who fast, rather to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees what’s cryptic will Himself give back to you in the light. ¹⁹“Stop treasuring for yourselves treasures

(During this time of silence, those who desire may come forward to receive ashes on their forehead. The ashes mark us as mortal sinners in need of God's mercy given through Jesus the Crucified. After the ashes have been placed on your forehead you may return to your seat.)

The Confession of Sin *Psalm 51:1-13 (Responsively) (We kneel)*

P: Have mercy on me, O God, according to Your unfailing love; according to Your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

C: Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

P: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.

C: Against You, You only, have I sinned and done what is evil in Your sight, so that You are proved right when You speak and justified when You judge.

P: Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.

C: Surely You desire truth in the inner parts; You teach me wisdom in the inmost place.

P: Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.

C: Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones You have crushed rejoice.

¹²“Yet even now,” declares the Lord, “Return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;

¹³and rend your hearts and not your garments.”

Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster.

¹⁴Who knows whether He will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the Lord your God?
