From the Elders . . .

The Preparations for the Ultimate Passover

As a former sailor, I am quite aware that most of what goes on in the two thirds of the world that is water, and that seaward realms are where ninety percent of all commerce takes place, is largely unknown to the general public. *Sea blindness*, except when oil prices soar. But there is a similar blindness in many of us (including me) on many Sundays.

Okay, Ray – just what are you talking about? Well, I am talking about our Altar Guild, headed by our Sacristans. Their work with bread, wine, chalice, flagon and linens are accomplished before we arrive for worship and completed after the postlude. Then vessels for sacred work are restored and elements unused returned to earth.

The only time we congregants see the Altar Guild in action is the *Stripping of the Altar* on Maundy Thursday. The rest of the year I tend to take their work for granted.

Tradition? Sure. But passed down from the Apostolic tradents. Before Jesus Christ instituted the Eucharist, He sent ahead Peter and John – probably His two closest disciples – to *prepare* the upper room for a proper Passover celebration. The synoptic gospels all affirm His orders.

Thus our Altar Guild continues in His instructions today. As Mother Mary said to the servants at the wedding in Cana, "Do whatever He tells you to do."

And performing the Holy Communion liturgy "decently and in order" should perhaps hold special meaning for us Lutherans. We actually believe the Body and Blood of Jesus is made present by the objective Word of God, *ex opere operato*. In with and under the bread and wine.

Some of our brothers and sisters in other Christian traditions hold that the Lord's Supper is merely a symbolic memorial. Others believe that the Real Presence is strictly spiritual and made possible by one's individual faith. In considering that, I remember that shortly after the first Holy Communion ten of the eleven recipients deserted. Hard to believe that their faith at that time could guarantee anything to be real. So, those of us who "believe, teach, and confess" the Augsburg Confession trust that the Real Presence has nothing to do with our own individual piety.

Our Altar Guild performs a truly holy work. Maybe I should acknowledge and thank them occasionally.

What makes Stephen Ministry successful is the ongoing training and supervision that provide the Stephen Ministers with the knowledge, practice and support that enable them to be present with those they care for and extend Christ's love to them. Christ is truly at the heart of this ministry.

Stephen Ministry enables people to respond to God's call to care for one another in a meaningful and effective way. Within the caring relationships, GOD works to strengthen faith. HIS presence encourages those receiving care - in the midst of the difficulties they face - to trust HIM.
